GP Pre-Referral Guidelines

3.0 Failure to thrive

Introduction

Failure to thrive is a descriptive term for children who have poor weight gain. (1-4) There are many definitions, including crossing two or more centiles over time (1, 3, 4) and weight persistently below the 3rd percentile. (1, 2, 4)

Whilst there are many potential causes to consider, it is common for no specific cause to be found. $^{(1-4)}$ If a child looks well, is developmentally normal with a normal clinical examination and initial investigations are normal, parents can be reassured that the long-term outlook is excellent. $^{(2, 3)}$

Pre-referral investigations (1, 2, 4)

- FBC, Iron studies, U&E's, LFT's, coeliac serology (if consuming gluten in diet)
- Urine MC&S
- Stool MC&S

Pre-referral treatment

If breast fed-baby, provide advice regarding breast feeding (1,3,4)

Dietetic referral for caloric supplementation (1,4)

When to refer

If receiving adequate calories for growth and failure to thrive is not explained by underlying disease.
