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


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What is IVH?



IVH stands for Intraventricular Haemorrhage, which means there is some bleeding inside a baby's brain.



All babies have **tiny** blood **vessels** in their **brain**.

Babies born too **early** might have **weaker** vessels that **bleed**.




Bleeding can happen if the baby has trouble breathing, is very small, if birth was hard, or if mum had an infection.

What are the signs?




Babies with **mild bleeding** may seem **fine**.

More **serious bleeding** might cause:



- Stops in breathing
- Slow heartbeat
- Seizures (shaking)
- Being cranky
- A soft spot on the head that sticks out




To **find** the **bleed**, **doctors** will check baby's brain with a tool called an **ultrasound**.


How is it treated?

1 - 4

Doctors use **grades** (1 to 4) to show how much **bleeding** there is:




- 1. A tiny bit of bleeding
- 2. A little more bleeding
- **3.** A **lot** of **bleeding** but **no harm** to the brain
- **4.** A **lot** of **bleeding** that might **hurt** the **brain**



Babies get a **brain scan** in the **first week** and **again** around **one month**.



There is **no medicine** that can **stop IVH**. But **doctors care** for the **baby** and help in other ways:



- Giving blood if the baby lost a lot
- If fluid builds up in the brain, doctors might need to take it out to keep the baby safe



Most babies with small bleeds do well. Bigger bleeds can lead to issues, and babies may need more help.
