

#### What is vitamin D?



This guide is about why and how to take **vitamin D**.




Vitamin D is very important for babies' healthy bones and muscles.



Babies get their initial dose of vitamin D from mum. Keeping your levels high will make sure your breast milk is healthy.



Every **baby** will need a **different** amount of **vitamin D**.



Follow the **dosage guide** given to you by our doctors, **stick** to the **amount** until **reviewed.** 



If you need **help**, please, ask **staff** for advice.

### How to use vitamin D



To give baby their **Vitamin D**, use a **dropper** or a **syringe**.



Put the **dropper** or **syringe** into **babies' mouth. Squeeze** to deliver the full dose.




**Don't mix** the **medication** into Babies' **bottle**. It's hard to tell if the full dose is given.



**Don't stress** if you **forget.** Give the dosage when you **remember** during the day.



It cannot be within 12 hours of the next dose. You do not need to wake baby up if they are sleeping.



Keep the **medication** in a **cool dry place** away from **kids**.
