


Workshops aim to directly build user skills and knowledge in a guided environment, with time to ask questions specific to your own project.

Workshop 1 - Navigating Research Ethics and Governance in WA (Ethics and Governance team, CAHS) If you are undertaking a research project or are thinking about becoming involved in research, understanding the review and approval requirements for your research project may appear intimidating. This workshop aims to help you understand the process of ethical and governance review for research approvals at CAHS - includes PCH, CACHS, CAHMS and Neonatology. 
